What is radon and why is it a risk?

The EPA estimates that there are about 20,000 lung cancer deaths every year that are radon-related. Exposure to radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer after smoking. Radon is an odorless, tasteless, and invisible gas produced by the decay of naturally occurring uranium in soil and water. Radon is found in outdoor air and indoor air of buildings of all kinds. There is no known safe level of radon exposure. The EPA recommends that Americans consider fixing their home for radon levels between 2 pCi/L and 4 pCi/L.

Zone 2 counties have a predicted average indoor radon screening level between 2 - 4 pCi/L (orange zones)	Moderate Potential

NHTSA Provides FREE VIN Searches for Vehicles

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) announced that starting in 2014, owners and potential buyers will be able to identify whether a safety recall for their specific vehicle is incomplete. This tool is available to check the VIN on cars, light trucks, and motorcycles.

To check your vehicle, use the free online search at www.SaferCar.gov.

CORN CASSEROLE Submitted by John O'Brien

Ingredients

1 (15 1/4-ounce) can whole kernel corn, drained 1 (14 3/4-ounce) can cream-style corn 1 (8-ounce) package corn muffin mix (recommended: Jiffy)

1 cup sour cream

1/2 stick butter, melted 1 to 1 1/2 cups shredded Cheddar

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. In a large bowl, stir together the 2 cans of corn, corn muffin mix, sour cream, and melted butter. Pour into a greased 9 by 13-inch casserole dish. Bake for 45 minutes, or until golden brown. Remove from oven and top with Cheddar. Return to oven for 5 to 10 minutes, or until cheese is melted. Let stand for at least 5 minutes and then serve warm.






