

# Pedestrian & Bicycle Safety

In 2012, 4,745 pedestrians were killed and approximately 76,000 were injured in the United States, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. The death of pedestrians were made up of 60 percent of working adults, 23 percent are elderly persons aged 65 or older, and 17 percent are children up to the age of 20.

As pedestrians, we need to utilize crosswalks and designated crossing locations. We can help our own safety by learning the proper use of pedestrian signals, make ourselves more visible in the dark by wearing reflective clothing or carrying a flashlight, obey all traffic laws, walking against the direction of traffic so you can see oncoming vehicles if there are no sidewalk is available, always using the crosswalk, and looking before crossing. Bicyclists should ride in the same direction of traffic, obey all traffic signs, signals, lane markings, yield to traffic, ride in a straight line, and use lights at night. Don't forget to wear a helmet! A bicycle rider or passenger under 16 years of age must wear a helmet.

We also need to educate ourselves as drivers to look for and stop for pedestrians. As a driver, I came across a pedestrian crosswalk situation that I was not sure of the Florida State law. Pedestrian crosswalks with yellow flashing lights seem to be popping up everywhere, on the beaches and on busy intersections. I dug up some information in regards to the law and stopping for these yellow flashing signs. I called the Pinellas County Sherriff's office and spoke with Deputy Edward DiLuzio. Deputy DiLuzio informed me that you must stop at

these crosswalks when this sign is lit up regardless if there is a pedestrian in the crosswalk or not. You must stop and yield to this flashing sign until the lights have shut off before you can proceed to drive your car through the crosswalk.


